Aim

The Trust's objective is to provide an above average level of income, income growth and long-term growth of capital through a policy of investing mainly in higher yielding UK FTSE 100 companies.

Risks & Features

Investment trusts are quoted companies listed on the London Stock Exchange. Their share prices are determined by factors including demand, or lack of, which means that the shares may trade below (at a discount to) or above (at a premium to) the underlying net asset value.

Merchants seeks to enhance returns for its shareholders through gearing, in the form of long-term, fixed rate debentures. Gearing can boost the Trust's returns when investments perform well, though losses can be magnified when investments lose value. You should be aware that this Trust may be subject to sudden and large falls in value and you could suffer substantial capital loss. Derivatives are used to manage the trust efficiently.

History

The Trust was incorporated in February 1889, making it the oldest of the investment trusts in the RCM stable. Initially it principally invested in the fixed interest securities of railway companies in the USA, Canada and South America, with the remainder held in Government securities and companies such as Castlemaine Brewery in Western Australia. The Trust now concentrates primarily upon major UK companies with an above average rate of dividend yield.

Fund Manager's Review



September saw a continuation of the recent market rally with the FTSE 100 index up nearly 5%, producing the strongest quarter in the FTSE's history with a total return of 21.9%. Evidence that major economies are emerging from recession prompted buying of cyclical stocks and financials with real estate and engineering leading the market although general retailers and mining both saw profit taking.

The Trust's NAV returned 5.2%. There were few major features with no individual stock position accounting for more than 0.25% of relative performance. Strong performance from BAE Systems and Aviva were the biggest positive contributors, along with not owning Lloyds Banking Group which fell back.

We added two new high yielding companies to the portfolio. Premier Farnell is a distributor of electronic and electrical components and stands to benefit from a recovery in the industrial cycle as a period of destocking ends. Ashmore is a one of the leading fund management companies in the specialist area of emerging market debt. We expect to see the resumption of the strong secular growth trend in this asset class. Elsewhere we reduced holdings in several medium sized companies which had performed well, including selling the remaining Dairy Crest investment.

The strength of the market rally has taken valuations up to less attractive, though still not expensive levels. We see attractions in many lowly priced defensive sectors like pharmaceuticals and utilities and we continue to find interesting opportunities across the broader market.





The Trust is a UK public limited company traded openly on the stock market. You can purchase shares through a stock broker.


